Overview

Established in 1983, ASEICA (Association pour le Soutien de l'Enseignement International sur la Côte d'Azur) is a non-profit association accredited by the French Ministry of Education that provides English language instruction in elementary school and in the humanities (literature and history-geography at the middle and high school levels) within French public schools. ASEICA employs over 40 teachers, a section director, a finance and administration manager, and an administrative team. The instruction prepares students for the Diplôme national du brevet « option internationale » and then the Baccalauréat Français International (BFI) - Option Américaine.

The over 40 ASEICA teachers are currently present in two primary schools (École Sartoux in Sophia Antipolis and École Trois Collines in Mougins), four middle schools (Collège International de Valbonne and Collège Niki de Saint Phalle in Valbonne, Collège l'Éganaude in Biot, and Collège Cesar in Roquefort les Pins) and one high school (Lycée International de Valbonne).

- Foster excellent communication and culture within the community;
- Raise the profile of the English Section graduates with the university systems in the US, Canada, and Europe;

- Recruit, retain, and compensate high quality faculty and staff;
- Examine internal systems and processes for effectiveness, efficiency and compliance.
