Founded in 1964, the school has evolved into one of the city's premier independent institutions, offering an innovative Montessori and International Baccalaureate coeducational journey from 18 months to 18 years.

Alcuin School is distinguished as one of the largest accredited Montessori schools in the U.S., serving families across the Dallas Metroplex. The school is one of the few schools worldwide that seamlessly integrates the Montessori approach in Toddler through Grade 6 with the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years and Diploma Programmes in Grade 6 through 12, creating a unique learning environment that nurtures the complete development of each child. Indeed, the school's distinctive combination of Montessori and IB programs empowers students to discern their special strengths while fostering a sense of independence, inquiry, and imagination.

Rooted in a rich history, Alcuin School has experienced remarkable growth and refinement over the years. From its humble beginnings in a two-story house in Highland Park to its current 12-acre tree-lined campus on Churchill Way, the school has continually expanded its facilities to include an Upper Elementary and Middle School, a gymnasium, library, Innovation Studio, state-of-the-art science lab, and a community center. In 2014, Alcuin launched its Upper School and the 7th Senior Class will graduate this year. It proudly enjoys an experienced, highly trained faculty and long-term familial connections within the most diverse community of students and families in the Dallas independent school market.

As the school looks toward the future, it seeks a new leader to build upon the legacy of retiring Head of School Walter Sorensen, who has served Alcuin for nearly fifteen years. - Embrace and champion the extraordinary diversity of backgrounds and experiences in the Alcuin community while supporting inclusive and equitable practices and policies;
- While actively listening to and respecting the variety of voices in the Alcuin community, build trust among faculty, staff, and parents through clear, collaborative, and firm decision-making;
- In partnership with the Director of Advancement and the Board of Trustees, invigorate annual giving and planning for a comprehensive capital and endowment campaign to support the emerging strategic plan;
- Oversee and be the lead ambassador of a marketing and branding program that differentiates and increases Alcuin's reputation and strengthens enrollment and waitlists;
- In partnership with the Chief Finance Officer and the Board of Trustees, support the school's sound financial management and stewardship of resources.
