Overview

Frankfurt International School (FIS) is a non-profit international school, providing students aged 3 to Grade 12 a world-class education across two campuses – FISO (age 3 to Grade 12) in Oberursel, and FISW (age 3 to Grade 8) in Wiesbaden. Current student enrollment is approximately 1,800 (1,600 at Oberursel and 200 in Wiesbaden). Founded in 1961, the school's teaching and learning practices are rooted in the International Baccalaureate (IB) with a strong emphasis on academic rigor and preparation for university studies. While academic success is at the center of school life, the arts, sciences, humanities, language learning, life skills and athletics provide the foundation for their learning community.

The Primary School is a purpose-built facility designed to foster the unique developmental needs of students in early childhood "First Steps" (age 3) through Grade 1. Located on its own footprint on the FISO campus, the school has large, bright classrooms, ample shared space for community time, and individualized areas for skill development such as occupational therapy and learning support.

FIS is accredited by the *New England Association of Schools and Colleges* (NEASC). It is also a founding member of the *International Baccalaureate Organization* (IBO) and has been offering the IB Diploma Programme for over 50 years, as well as an American High School Diploma. The school is a founding member of the *European Council of International Schools* (ECIS), which was renamed The Educational Collaborative for International Schools in 2016 and is also a member of the *Association for German International Schools* (AGIS).



POSITION OVERVIEW

The Primary School Principal is an experienced instructional leader and administrative head of the Primary School (PS). The successful candidate will have relevant knowledge and experience with developmentally appropriate practices for this age group, will have expertise in leading early childhood professionals towards current best practices and in supporting parents with young chil-dren through their growth and development. The Primary School principal is responsible for the day-to-day management of a safe, healthy, inclusive and positive learning environment for all chil-dren, in keeping with the FIS Mission and Beliefs. The principal supervises the faculty and staff of the Primary School and will collaborate with other members of the school's leadership team to ensure alignment and a positive overall school culture. This position reports to the Head of School and is a member of the School Wide Leadership Team, engages with the Board of Trustees through committee work and showcase presentations, and also leads joint school-wide strategic leadership around specifc impacts.

The primary school will welcome the new principal to a student-centered, engaged community of colleagues and parents. The teachers are excellent and the parents are passionate about the special experience the Primary School provides. As the cost of international education increases, early childhood education is an area where parents may defer school enrollment to an older age. As a school we must market and deliver the exceptional characteristics which makes our Primary School worth the investment for families living in the region.

Frankfurt International School is committed to ensuring the safeguarding and well-being of its students and expects all faculty, staff, and volunteers to share this commitment.
