




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Mission Statement

Overview

As the oldest continuously operated coeducational school in the city, Friends Seminary has prepared students in Kindergarten through Grade 12 for success in college and beyond since 1786. A Friends School rooted in Quaker values; Friends Seminary emphasizes character development as much as it does college preparation. Inspired by the Quaker testimonies of peace, integrity, equality, and simplicity, faculty forge a curriculum that helps students locate their innate curiosity and exercise their imaginations through a program of study that embraces learning in the classrooms, on the fields and stages, in the community, and throughout the world.

Located in the Gramercy Park neighborhood, the school attracts students from across New York and New Jersey and is valued for how it integrates its program into the life of the city while promoting a global outlook. Institutional commitments to service and respect for others yield a community that is giving and nurturing, that embraces differences and seeks to recognize "that of God" in everyone, seeing past distinctions and identifying the common threads of humanity.
